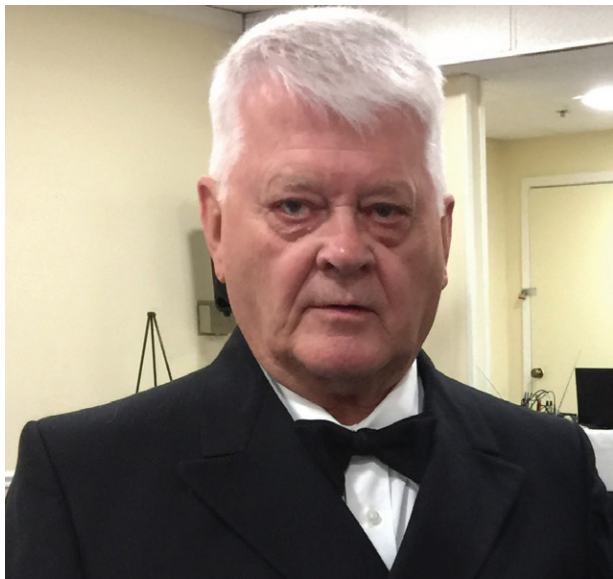

Advanced Marine Navigation Course Coming This August!

We are excited to announce that the Beta version of the Advanced Marine Navigation course is now available. Commander Gary Callahan and I will be serving as instructors when the course begins in August.

Advanced Marine Navigation teaches today's boaters how to use modern electronic navigation tools, including chart plotters with vector charts, to plan routes and safely navigate more challenging waters. The course is designed for members who have successfully completed either the Piloting or Marine Navigation course and are ready to expand their navigation skills.

This course is the second of four courses in America's Boating Club® / United States Power Squadrons® navigation curriculum:

- Marine Navigation
- Advanced Marine Navigation
- Offshore Navigation
- Celestial Navigation

Building on the knowledge gained in Piloting and Marine Navigation, this course focuses on the Plan–Navigate–Check process that forms the foundation of safe and effective navigation.

Students will learn how to use electronic chart plotting systems to create routes, verify route legs, determine

distances and bearings, and monitor vessel progress. Particular emphasis is placed on route planning, identifying hazards, avoiding restricted areas, and maintaining situational awareness while underway.

The course uses OpenCPN, a comprehensive and free open-source chart plotting software used by tens of thousands of boaters worldwide. OpenCPN utilizes official electronic charts provided by the National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration (NOAA) and the Army Corps of Engineers (ACE). Because of its versatility and accessibility, OpenCPN has been selected for use in our navigation curriculum. Students will gain hands-on experience with a navigation system that can be used for voyage planning and real-world navigation aboard virtually any vessel. During route planning exercises, students will learn how to establish departure points, create routes to destinations, enter waypoints, verify route legs, and calculate distances and bearings. They will also learn how to reverse routes and use reciprocal bearings for return trips.

A critical component of the course is route verification. Before getting underway, navigators must carefully review each route leg for potential hazards, obstructions, shoal water, and restricted areas. Routes consist of a series of straight-line segments connected by waypoints, and proper waypoint placement is essential for safe navigation. Ultimately, the navigator is responsible for efficiently managing the Plan–Navigate–Check process to ensure the safety of the vessel and crew. This responsibility should never be taken lightly. Even a momentary lapse in attention or poor judgment can result in vessel damage, grounding, or worse. Fortunately, modern GPS technology and electronic navigation systems provide navigators with continuous position information and powerful tools to support sound decision-making.

Whether your goal is coastal cruising, exploring unfamiliar waterways, or increasing your confidence on the water, Advanced Marine Navigation will provide valuable skills that make boating safer and more enjoyable.

Hey Boaters

New Advanced Marine Navigation

Advanced Marine Navigation teaches today's boaters how to use electronic navigation tools, including chartplotters with vector charts, to plan routes and navigate in more challenging conditions. Students use OpenCPN, a free charting program, to learn and complete the charting work for the course. Topics include:

- Advanced positioning techniques, such as advancing a line of position to obtain a running fix
- Use of a variety of electronic tools: radar, depth sounders, autopilots, chart plotters, laptop computer software, and more
- Hazard avoidance techniques using electronics (e.g. avoidance waypoints or safety zones in GPS)
- Collision avoidance using radar, GPS, and AIS
- Working with the tide and current data to determine clearances, depth of water, and effects of current
- Piloting in various wind and current conditions
- Simple skills for checking that one is on course
- Putting it all together with a Practice Cruise

VESSEL SAFETY CHECKS



VESSEL SAFETY CHECK (VSC)

A major component of a fun filled outing is a reliable boat which has all the necessary equipment operating properly. A free vessel safety check (VSC) is an important safe-guard, and our certified examiners will be happy to perform the check for you. There are no negative consequences if you don't pass. Our goal is simply to help make boating as safe as possible for you, your family and your friends, through education.

The United States Power Squadrons and the U.S. Coast Guard Auxiliary are partners in this valuable program offered to the boating public. All examiners are certified and trained on the latest requirements. The Vessel Safety Check is similar to the review that is performed by the U.S. Coast Guard if you are boarded, except that it is voluntary, and only you receive the results. Our Vessel Safety Examiners will perform a 15 point safety check which includes:

Display of Numbers	Registration/Documentation	Visual Distress Signals (VDS)
Personal Flotation Devices (PFD)	Fire Extinguishers	Ventilation
Backfire Flame Control	Sound Producing Devices	Navigation Lights
Pollution Placard	MARPOL Track Placard	Marine Sanitation Devices
Navigation Rules	State and/or Local Requirements	Overall Vessel Condition

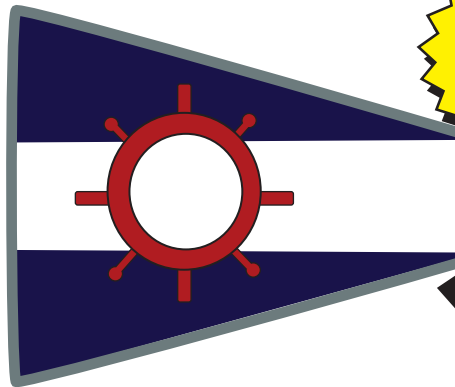
